Utilizing many arrangements and original compositions by their multi-talented baritone, Jay Giallombardo, the versatile and personable foursome sang their way upwards through the contest ranks. They were acclaimed for their inventive and entertaining routines, coupled with a full and unique sound.

Along the way, they made fans of audiences across the Society. A roaring crowd was on its feet in Minneapolis when Grandma's Boys were announced as the barbershop harmony society's gold medal winners in 1979.
